

St. Margaret's Church – Lowestoft

Fishermen's Memorial

1860 - 1923

Situated on the North Wall of the Church, the Fishermen's Memorial consists of 14 Oak Panels. Onto these panels the names of 217, who lost their lives at sea, have been engraved. The first 18 engravings were done on Saturday, 6th February 1909, with the Memorial being unveiled by the Mayor of Lowestoft, Mr. H.G.Jones on Sunday, February 7th, 1909, with additional portions being added in 1936 and 1944. Its inscription reads, "To the Glory of God and in Memory of Those Fishermen from this coast who have lost Their Lives at Sea whilst in pursuit of their calling this Faithful Record is Dedicated". A.D.M.C.M.1.X. The first two panels are known as the Brame Memorial with the second two as the Sterry Memorial.

The early engravings were done ONLY for the Master/Skipper of the vessel lost. This listing includes all the known crew members, both from Lowestoft and elsewhere, as a fitting tribute to all of them who lost their lives at sea.

Ablett, Albert William – Aged 23 – Seaman – May – 20/11/1893

(see Cooper, William Robert)

Adams, James Frederick – Aged 46 – Skipper – Loch Fyne – 6/9/1915

Reported as drowning when the "Loch Fyne" went missing, supposedly after hitting a mine or possible sunk by a submarine. Crew members also missing; George Douglas Brown, George Bunn & James Frank Nunn.

Adams, Robert - Aged 35 – Seaman – Rose of Sharon – 2/2/1883

(see Smith John)

Agus, James – Aged 19 – Cook – Renown – 10/3/1913

Reported as drowning when the "Renown" was stranded on rocks, in thick fog on the west side of Towan Head, Newquay, when it was returning to Padstow from the fishing grounds. He lost his life as he scrambled ashore over the rocks as the lifeboat could not get near to the ship or him. All of the other crew managed to gain the shore. At the Enquiry, the Master said that the fog was so thick that he could not see any lights of other ships or land.

Aldred, Fred – Aged 35 – Fisherman – Lord Carnarvon – 19/11/1914

Reported as drowning when the "Lord Carnarvon" was sunk by a mine off Gorleston. The Drifter carried a crew of 10, including three Skippers, who served

to make up the complement. Crew members also missing; Clifford Bird, Robert Bond, Amos Catchpole, William Finch, John Fisk, Alexander Grey, Doctor Spall, John W. Temple & Albert Utting.

Aldred, William – Aged 56 - 3rd Hand – Kestrel – 16/7/1921

Reported as drowning when the “Kestrel” went missing in the North Sea 6 miles ENE of Smiths Knoll.

Aldrick, Albert – Aged 25 – Seaman – Maud – 15/11/1882

Alexander, George Richard – Aged 30 – Mate – Reliance – 7/10/1917

(see Sarbutt, Albert George)

Alp, James – Aged 32 – Skipper – Energy – 30/5/1911

Reported as drowning near Outer Dowsing Light Vessel.

Andersen, Alfred – Aged 20 – Steward – Sea Bird – 1/11/1913

(see Edgley, William Bertie)

Andrews, John – Aged 50 – Owner/Master – I.A.M. - 11/11/1891

Reported drowning when the “I.A.M.” floundered (filled with water and sank) 90 miles SE of Lowestoft in a gale. Crew also missing; John Thomas Andrews and James Rolley. Some reports mistakenly name the vessel as J.A.M.

Andrews, John Thomas – Aged 25 - Mate – I.A.M – 11/11/1891

Anson, George Copestick – Aged 23 - 3rd Hand – Irma – 18/6/1922

Reported as drowning when he fell overboard 35 miles from Lowestoft.

Armes, Charles George – Aged 19 – Engine Driver – Renown – 3/12/1900

Reported as drowning after the “Renown” was run-down by SS “Sardinian” in the entrance to the Stanford Channel, whilst drift-net fishing, off Lowestoft. Crew members also missing; Walter Charles Long & Joseph Rumsby.

Ashby, James – Aged 31 - 3rd Hand – Chrysolite – 4/7/1917

Aunguish, Daniel – Aged 25 – Seaman – Maud – 15/11/1882

(see Butcher, James William)

Ayers, Arthur William – Aged 30 – Cook – Ebenezer – 3/10/1921

Reported as drowning when he was washed overboard 45 miles E by N of Lowestoft.

Ayers, John – Aged 26 – Seaman – Donum Patris – 28/12/1886

(see Boyce, Thomas Scarll)

Ayers, Robert Benjamin – Aged 19 – Boy – Defender – 4/11/1902

(see Sterry, Frederick John Cook)

Baker, George – Aged 28 – Cook – Conqueror – 30/9/1911

Reported as drowning when the “Conqueror” sailed for the fishing grounds and was lost in strong gales. Crew members also missing; Henry Moat, Albert Edward Reed, William Reed & John Russell.

Baldry, Ernest William – Aged 45 - 3rd Hand – Splendour – 2/1/1923

Reported as drowning when the “Splendour” was run down by the Cunard SS “Antonia” and sank. Crew members also missing; James William Bowler, John Edward Gurney & Peter Ernest Mosey (listed as Moxey on some reports)

Ball, George – Aged 19 – Motorman – Ivanhoe – 9/1/1919

Reported as drowning when the “Ivanhoe” went missing with all hands. Crew members also missing; George Brown, Henry Broadway Golding, Benjamin James Robinson, John William James Tucker, Edward Wirebrook Wills & Charles Church.

Balls, Herbert James – Aged 20 – Net Ropeman – I'll Try – 2/11/1905

Reported as drowning 28 miles E. of Lowestoft. Crew member also missing; Austin William Burroughs.

Bancalari, Arthur James – Aged 21 - 3rd Hand – Sea Bird – 1/11/1913

(see Edgley, William Bertie)

Barber, A – Aged 56 – Fisherman – Herring Finder – 14/6/1917

Reported as drowning when the “Herring Finder” sunk after a collision in fog off Beachy Head when bound for Lowestoft from Newlyn. Crew members also missing; Issac Botwright, Austin William Burrows, Henry Charles Day & George Henry Long.

Barber, William – Aged 20 – Seaman – Donum Patris – 28/12/1886

(see Boyce, Thomas Scarll)

Barrett, Walter – Aged 25 – Mate – Superb – 24/10/1882

(see Yallop, James William)

Batley, Albert - Aged 50 - 3rd Hand – Proficient – 18/11/1921

Reported as drowning when he fell overboard 3 miles NE from Haisboro Light Vessel.

Beamish, Frank Ernest – Aged 29 – Engineer – W.A.Massey – 11/3/1918

(see James, Albert Edward John)

Beck, Philip William – Aged 21 – Cook – Proficient – 15/2/1922

Reported death from heart failure after falling overboard. Skipper Alec Penham jumped in to save him but he was unconscious when pulled back on board and despite application of artificial respiration, he never recovered.

Beckham, Alfred Frederick – Aged 20 – Stoker – Conifier – 1/12/1913

Reported as drowning 30 miles NE of Lowestoft.

Bedwin, John – Aged 17 – Capstanman – Superb – 24/10/1882

(see Yallop, James William)

Belton, Joseph – Aged 27 – Mate – Primula – 19/3/1923

Reported as drowning when thrown overboard with the skipper when plating the trawl warp with an iron spike when the vessel gave a heavy lurch in a very rough sea. The skipper was saved.

Bennett, Robert(John) – Aged 63 - 3rd Hand – Young Bert – 30/7/1917

(see Cook, John)

Benns, Edward - Aged 55 – Cook – Una – 24/7/1913

Reported as drowning when the “Una” was lost in the North Sea. His body was found at sea by a Great Yarmouth shrimper 18 miles outside Smiths Knoll, Gorleston. The body of Wilfred James Long was washed ashore at Walberswick on 3/8/1913. Crew members also missing; John William Burton Davis, William Edward Firman & Charles Wright.

Bensley, Ernest William – Aged 35 – Mate – Leslie – 4/12/1907

Reported as drowning when he fell overboard 3 miles N of N. Ower Buoy.

Benton, Charles Henry - Aged 23 – Mate – Vigilant – 20/2/1910

Reported as drowning when the “Vigilant” went missing when fishing out of Padstow being last seen between Godrevy and Trevoze. “Deaths at Sea “ lists him as Harry Benton. Crew members also missing; William Henry Cropley, James George Garwood, John Richard Rose & J.G. (George) Hall.

Bird, Clifford – Aged 35 – Skipper – Lord Carnarvon – 19/11/1914

Black, John – Aged 23 – Cook – Chanticleer – 7/8/1908

(see Hart, Ernest Edward)

Blowers, Frederick William – Aged 16 – Stoker – Emily – 12/10/1920

Reported as drowning when a rope knocked him overboard 12 miles E by S Lowestoft.

Blowers, William H. - Aged 30 - 4th Hand – Free Lance – 24/2/1903

Boggis, William – Aged 47 – Seaman – Reliance – 7/10/1917

(see Sarbutt, Albert George)

Bond, Robert – Aged 50 – Fisherman – Lord Carnarvon – 19/11/1914

(see Aldred, Fred) Robert Bond was one of the Skipper's who made up the crew compliment for this trip.

Boon, Henry – Aged – 39 – Mate – Skimmer of the Sea – 14/10/1881

Bottoms, Richard George – Aged 38 – Passenger - Friendship – 28/1/1912

Botwright, Issac – Aged 30 – Fisherman – Herring Finder – 14/6/1917

Bowler, Edward – Aged 45 – Skipper – Young Bert – 30/7/1917

Bowler, James William – Aged 55 – Skipper – Splendour – 2/1/1923

(see Baldry, Ernest William)

Boyce, Thomas Scarll - Aged 30 – Mate – Donum Patris – 28/12/1886

Reported as drowning, with all 9 crew, when the “Donum Patris” was believed to have capsized in a gale whilst herring fishing in the North Sea. A clinker built boat, bottom up, answering to her description, was seen to drift past the Smith's Knoll Light Vessel. Crew members also missing; John Ayers, William Barber, John Fish, Samuel Gower, James Greengrass, John Smith. George Snowling & George Youngman.

Braga, Herbert – Aged 22 – Seaman – Red Rose – 6/3/1883

Broome, George Frederick – Aged 21 - 3rd Hand – Boy Horace – 4/2/1906

Reported as drowning 50 miles SSE of Lowestoft.

Brown, Charles – Aged 27 – Deck Hand – Faithful Friend – 23/10/1922

Reported as drowning 160 miles NE by N off Smiths Knoll.

Brown, George – Aged 18 - 4th Hand – Ivanhoe – 9/1/1919

Brown, George Douglas - Aged 37 - Mate – Loch Fyne – 6/9/1915

Reported as drowning 3 miles ESE from Lowestoft.

Bullard, George Henry – Aged 44 – Mate – Lord Cromer – 17/8/1912

Reported as drowning at North Shields Fish Quay.

Bullard, John Samuel - Aged 27 – Mate – Wanderer – 29/11/1905

Reported as drowning when the "Wanderer" went missing after collision with an unknown schooner in a force 6 NE by E wind 6 miles ESE of Lowestoft.

Bunn, George – Aged 15 - 4th Hand – Loch Fyne - 6/9/1915

Burder, Joseph Thomas – Aged 29 – Cook – Charles Henry – 5/7/1895

Reported as drowning when he fell overboard. He was alone on deck at the time. "Deaths at Sea" and "Ships Index Cards" lists him as Birda.

Burgess, James – Aged 52 – Skipper – Retriever – 20/11/1907

Reported that he died of Syncope (fainting from a fall in blood pressure) 4 miles NE of Knoll Light Ship, Lowestoft.

Burgoyne, Robert – Aged 69 - Mate – Mistletoe – 7/5/1919

Burroughs, Austin William – Aged 29 – Fisherman – I'll Try – 2/11/1905

(see Balls, Herbert James)

Burrows, Austin William–Aged 34-Engine Driver–Herring Finder- 14/6/1917

(see Barber, A)

Burrows, Ernest Edward - Aged 22 – Net Rope Man – Test – 30/10/1911

Reported as drowning 6 miles NE of Smith's Knoll.

Butcher, George – Aged 43 – Hawseman – Friendship – 28/1/1912

Reported as drowning when the "Friendship" was wrecked on the French Coast, of Sangatte, South of Calais, when on its passage for the westward voyage. Crew members also missing; James Neave, George Rouse & William George Wright. Also Richard George Bottoms as a passenger. The remainder were saved by the Calais lifeboat "Marguerite". At the Enquiry, it was suggested that the master was not sober.

Butcher, James William – Aged 42 – Master – Maud – 15/11/1882

Reported as drowning when the "Maud" was wrecked. It was last seen crossing Leman Sands in very heavy weather. Crew members also missing; Matthew Butcher, John Capps, Albert Aldrick, George Prime, Daniel Aunguish, William Thompson, William Mower, Robert Codlins & William Brown.

Butcher, Matthew – Aged 31 – Mate – Maud – 15/11/1882

Butler, John Leonard – Aged 36 – Skipper/Owner – Henry Wesley-
20/11/1888

Reported as drowning when “Henry Wesley” went missing off Texel when fishing. Crew members also missing; James Cole, William Robert Knights, James Spall & Samuel Syred.

Cable, Frederick George – Aged 38 – Seaman – Reliance – 7/10/1917

Capps, Issac John – Aged 19 – Seaman – Maud – 15/11/1882

Carr, Henry – Aged 37 – Steward – Skimmer of the Sea – 14/10/1881
Reported as drowning when the “Skimmer of the Sea” was lost after leaving North Shields, loaded with coal, for Lowestoft. Crew members also missing; William Cook, Henry Boon, William Munnings, John Buck, James Olley & Arthur Thurston.

Casey, James – Aged 22 – Deck Hand – Angle – 7/1/1924

Catchpole, Amos – Aged 43 – Fisherman - Lord Carnarvon –
19/11/1914

Catchpole, James – Aged 24 – Seaman – May – 20/11/1893
(see Cooper, William Robert)

Chaston, Robert – Aged 21 – Fisherman – Hilda Maud – 26/8/1912
Reported as drowning when the “Hilda Maud” was lost on Corton Sands with all hands. “Deaths at Sea” incorrectly lists vessel name as “Hilda Mand” for Robert Chaston. Crew members also missing; William Knights, Frederick Matthews, Arthur Peck, Ernest Rouse, Arthur Smith, Jacob Smith, William James Taylor, Henry Tillett & Oliver Russell Tillett.

Chenery, Arthur – Aged 30 – Deck Hand – Cetus – 29/1/1920
Reported as drowning accidental when he was pulled overboard by the trawl net 45 miles ESE of Lowestoft.

Chilvers, Henry – Aged 31 – Skipper – Gratitude – 30/9/1911
Reported as drowning when washed overboard by shipping when the main boom, sails and small boat was carried away 40 miles SE of Lowestoft. Crew members also missing; Robert Charles Harvey & Arthur Rayner

Church, Charles – Aged 30 – Cook – Ivanhoe – 9/1/1919
(see Ball, George)

Church, George – Aged 40 - 3rd Hand – Queen of Devon – 15/12/1914
Reported as drowned when the “Queen of Devon” was sunk by a mine 55 miles E by N from Lowestoft. Crew members also missing; Arthur Collins Snr, Arthur Collins Jnr & George Herbert Critten.

Church, George Harry – Aged 17 – Cook – W.A.Massey – 11/3/1918

(see James, Albert Edward John)

Clark, Charles – Aged 46 - Master– Free Lance – 24/2/1903

Reported as drowning when the “Free Lance” went missing after leaving Lowestoft for the fishing grounds but was not seen again. Crew members also missing; William H. Blowers, George Dann, Walter Dann & George R. Garner. Wreckage and the body of George Dann was trawled up by the “Unity” on 26/4/1903.

Clarke, Ernest John – Aged 35 – Deck Hand – Ivy – 18/12/1914

Reported as drowning when the “Ivy” was sunk by a mine 52 miles E by N of Lowestoft. Crew members also missing; Edward G. Gamble, William Henry Hills, Arthur Edward Melhuish & William Wilkin.

Claxton, Thomas John Tucker – Aged 16 – Cook – Boy Jack - 26/7/1918

Reported as drowning when the “Boy Jack” was sunk by a time-bomb laid by enemy submarine UB No. 40, 4 miles E of Cross Sands Light Vessel. Crew members also missing; Frederick Thomas Crouchen & Frederick Albert Simons. Also listed on memorial are T. Smith, H. Doy & H. Doy Jnr but these are not listed by “Deaths at Sea”, therefore it is possible that these named engravings on the Memorial were survivors (see individual names). Records also state that Harry Howe was Skipper and that Claxton was drowned from the U Boat, on approach of WMML 127, that picked up just 2 survivors.

Cockell, Victor James – Aged 21 – Skipper – Industry – 29/9/1911

Listed on Memorial as Cockel. Reported as drowning after the “Industry” was last seen 40 miles ESE of Lowestoft in the great gale recorded for that day. Wreckage was picked up near the West Minder Light Vessel. Crew members also missing; Frank Coog, Robert Cossey, William Thomas Melhuish, Sydney Rose & Charles William Henry Tuttle.

Codlins, Robert – Aged 21 – Seaman – Maud – 15/11/1882

Colby, Chester Frank – Aged 25 – Deck Hand – Nancy – 22/12/1909

Reported as drowning when the “Nancy” sunk in a collision with the Steam Carrier “Brutus” , 50 miles ENE of Lowestoft. Crew members also missing; Alfred Cudmore, Thomas David Ellis & Frank Hayward.

Cole, James – Aged 14 - 5th Hand Boy – Henry Wesley – 20/11/1888

Reported as drowning when washed overboard by heavy seas 28 miles SE from Lowestoft.

Cook, James William – Aged 50 – Seaman – May – 20/11/1893

(see Cooper, William Robert)

Cook, John – Aged 40 – Mate – Young Bert – 30/7/1917

Reported as drowning when the “Young Bert” was blown up by a time-bomb, laid by UC No. 63 off the Humber. Crew members also missing; Robert(John) Bennett, Edward Bowler, Thomas Eglinton & Arnott Smith.

Cook, Sidney – Aged 34 – Skipper – W.A.Massey – 11/3/1918

(see James, Albert Edward John)

Cook, William – Aged 48 – Master – Skimmer of the Sea – 14/10/1881

(see Carr, Henry)

Cooke, Hector James – Aged 27 - Mate – Home Bay – 12/3/1890

(see Rudd, William George)

Cooper, John Thomas – Aged 30 – Skipper – Fisherman – 7/11/1894

Reported as accidental drowning near Smith's Knoll Lightship bearing NNW distant 5 miles.

Cooper, William Joseph – Aged 51 – Skipper – Mistletoe – 7/5/1919

Reported as being killed at sea when the “Mistletoe” was lost after hitting a mine. Crew also missing; Robert Burgoyne.

Cooper, William Robert – Aged 36 – Master – May – 20/11/1893

Reported as drowning when the “May” foundered (ship filled with water and sank) when herring fishing. Crew members also missing; Albert William Ablett, James Catchpole, James William Cook, George William Knights, William Henry Liffen, William James Mewse & William Rose.

Cossey, Robert – Aged 27 - 3rd Hand – Industry – 29/9/1911

(see Cockell. Victor James)

Crickmore, Alfred William – Aged 21 - 4th Hand – Iceni – 22/3/1915

Reported as drowning after supposed to have fallen overboard, 55 miles E by N from Lowestoft. The “Iceni” was later sunk by a time-bomb laid by UB.13, under Skipper, Herbert Nathaniel Mills, 15 miles E of Lowestoft on 27/7/1915.

Crickmore, John James – Aged 45 – Skipper – Narcissus – 13/11/1909

Reported as drowning 50 miles ENE of Lowestoft.

Critten, George Herbert – Aged 44 - Mate – Queen of Devon – 15/12/1914

(see Church, George)

Crooks, James – Aged 47 – Rank Unknown – Chanticleer? - 1919

Not listed on “Deaths at Sea”. No details of cause of death found or any record of placing him on the “Chanticleer” at the time of death. Possible mistake on Memorial.

Crouchen, Frederick Thomas – Aged 39 – Mate – Boy Jack – 21/7/1918

Listed on Memorial as S. Crouching and on “Deaths at Sea” as Thomas Frederick Crouchem. (see Claxton, Thomas John Tucker)

Cropley, William Henry – Aged 32 - 3rd Hand – Vigilant – 20/2/1910

(see Benton, Charles Henry)

Crowford, Alfred – Aged 34 – Engineer – Reliance – 7/10/1917

Some lists as Crawford. (see Sarbutt, Albert George)

Cudmore, Alfred – Aged 50 - Mate – Nancy – 22/12/1909

Dann, George – Aged 30 – Mate – Free Lance – 24/2/1903

Davis, John Robert – Aged 25 - 3rd Hand – Young Admiral – 31/1/1915

Reported as drowning after being washed overboard when the decks of the “Young Admiral” were swept by heavy seas whilst fishing 45 miles E of Lowestoft. Note; The “Young Admiral” was sunk later by a time-bomb laid by UB 10, 17miles NE by E from Cromer, under Skipper Reginald Snowling, on 11/8/1915.

Doy, Henry (Harry) – Aged 42 – Hawseman – Present Friends -

12/2/1926 Reported as drowning 45 miles NW of Longships Lighthouse. (see Claxton, Thomas)
